

### **Systematic review training opportunity in New Delhi, India**

This four-day training programme is aimed at enhancing the systematic review skills of researchers who are interested in conducting systematic reviews on pressing international development issues. The training is part of a project which aims to promote capacity in systematic reviewing among researchers in South Asia. It is led by ICDDR,B and implemented in collaboration with the Campbell Collaboration, the Medical Research Council of the United Kingdom, the Campbell & Cochrane Equity Methods Group and 3ie. Funding is being provided by the UK Department for International Development (DFID).

The training will focus on how to use systematic reviews to assess the effectiveness of complex interventions, using examples from social welfare, education, international development, nutrition, and climate change.
